

WATER METER PROJECT COMPLETED



The City of Pasadena has completed the water meter project. RBR now has a hydrant that will measure the water we use, specifically for the water truck. The other water meter is next to it, in a box. The top can be lifted to view our water usage for the REST of our property. This will be a new expense for the RBR. We know that

ROSE BOWL RIDERS JUMPING CLINIC WITH TRAINER RICHARD SPOONER: December 19-20, 2020

Richard Spooner is an internationally successful equestrian. He competes in the sport of show jumping on the West Coast of the United States and in Europe. He is a multi-Grand Prix Champion rider, and he has been named Pacific Coast Horse Show Association Grand Prix Rider of the Year on 12 occasions. Richard has the nickname "The Master of Faster" in the jumping arena.

We were honored to have Richard spend the weekend at RBR for our 2020 Jumping Clinic where he shared his "Pearls of Wisdom" with our members, by explaining the importance of stringing together every action during a course, and approaching the fences with confidence and encouragement for your horse. He took the time to help riders of all levels to be thoughtful about her riding from every aspect, including tack positioning, body posture, and mental connection with the horse. With a patient and intentional style, Richard provided words of encouragement and constructive critique to advance each participant to a new level of her riding. This was an experience our riders walked away from yearning for more.
